More recently just before spring break, the pedestrian bridge over Sugar Run Creek that connects Tumblebrook Dr. and Brooksview Circle by the pond has been rebuilt for the first time in over 20 years and looks amazing.

April Showers Bring May Flowers





Spring has finally sprung! Which means, flowers are blooming, grass is growing, trees are budding, weeds are sprouting, allergies are out of control...and yardwork, yardwork & more yardwork needs done!

This is the time of year when lots of outdoor projects start. Please remember that you must submit all landscaping projects to the ARC for approval before starting! Approvals are good for 6 months, so don't wait to submit!

What we will be looking for this spring & how to avoid violations

- General landscaping Please make sure your grass is cut and not getting too tall. Make sure weeds in flower beds are removed and dandelions are treated.
- Curb weeds It is the owner's responsibility (not the city)
 to make sure weeds are not growing in the cracks along
 the street along your property line.
- Power washing North facing sides of your house that don't get much sun have a tendency to grow moss on siding over the winter and early spring when it is damp.
 Please make sure this is cleaned/power washed.
- Wood Fences Please make sure all white wood fencing is clean, does not have dull or chipping paint, and does not have any broken posts.
- Trash & Recycling Bins You cannot have trash or recycling bins visible from the street. Bins must either be kept inside a garage or have proper screening if left outside. This has been an ongoing issue in all parts of the community for a long time.
- Walkways Brick walkways & patios tend to grow moss and weeds. Please makes sure you are pulling or power washing out all vegetation growth in between the bricks.
- Signs Business advertising signs are only permitted while a project is under construction and must be removed as soon as the project is complete. Graduation signs are permitted for up to 4 weeks during the graduation season.
- **Flags** See section **G**. of the design guidelines for what is approved.

FRIENDLY REMINDER

If you are having your roof replaced, you must submit for approval through the ARC prior to starting this project. Several roofing projects have been started recently without having the proper approvals and have received violations & fines. Roofing projects are very obvious to spot, and we will make sure you receive a fine if you are not following the guidelines.
